With the Participating Provider Network, members have the freedom to choose their doctor for each visit – no referral needed.

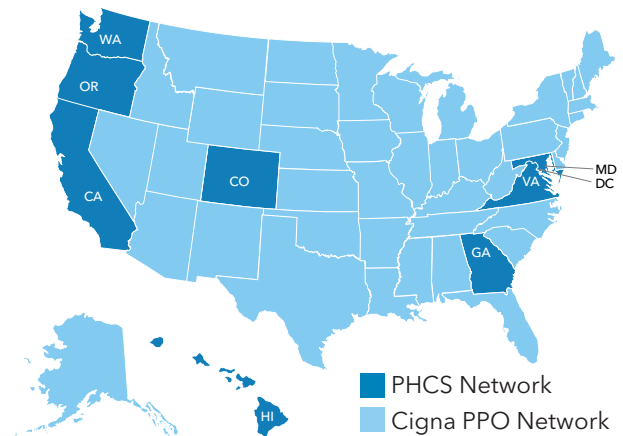
Plus, there are:

- Lower out-of-pocket costs.
- No claim forms to complete.
- No unexpected costs at the time of service. Members only pay their copay or coinsurance at their visit.

For some services, like outpatient surgery and complex imaging, members will need to get precertification for care at PHCS Network providers. Cigna PPO Network providers will do this for them.

## Nationwide coverage

In Kaiser Permanente states, members can get care from the PHCS Network.<sup>5,6</sup> In all other states, they can visit Cigna PPO Network providers.
